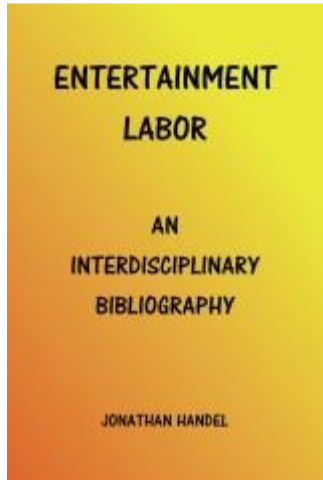


Entertainment Labor: An Interdisciplinary Bibliography



Jonathan Handel's new book, *Entertainment Labor: An Interdisciplinary Bibliography* is a 345-page annotated bibliography of over 1,500 books, articles, dissertations, legal cases and other resources dealing with entertainment unions and guilds and various other aspects of entertainment labor.

The citations include the following:

- 138 social science books about, or with portions about, entertainment labor
- 27 biographies of figures such as Ronald Reagan who played key roles in entertainment labor

- 132 theses and dissertations
